Abstract

This lecture examines historical transfer of elements of material culture, including ceramics and architectural elements. from the eastern Iranian world to Europe and North America, as well as more incidents of looted recent material entering museums and the art market, and the ways in these objects which are displayed. traded and. on to their occasion. returned country of origin.





There are four main case studies, two sites in Iran and two types of material from site in а Afghanistan, and these include lustre tiles taken in the nineteenth century, as well as lustre ceramic vessels and marble dado panels looted from Afghan museums since 1979. The various legal, ethical and moral issues around the continued trade and display of this material is examined, in order to highlight both the nature and the complexity of the subject, and the interconnections between archaeology, museums and the art market.



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
