The 20-year excavation project targets one of the largest pre-Roman urban sites in central Anatolia, at a time a major Late Bronze Age centre, the capital of a Middle Iron Age kingdom, and later an important Persian and Seleucid city.

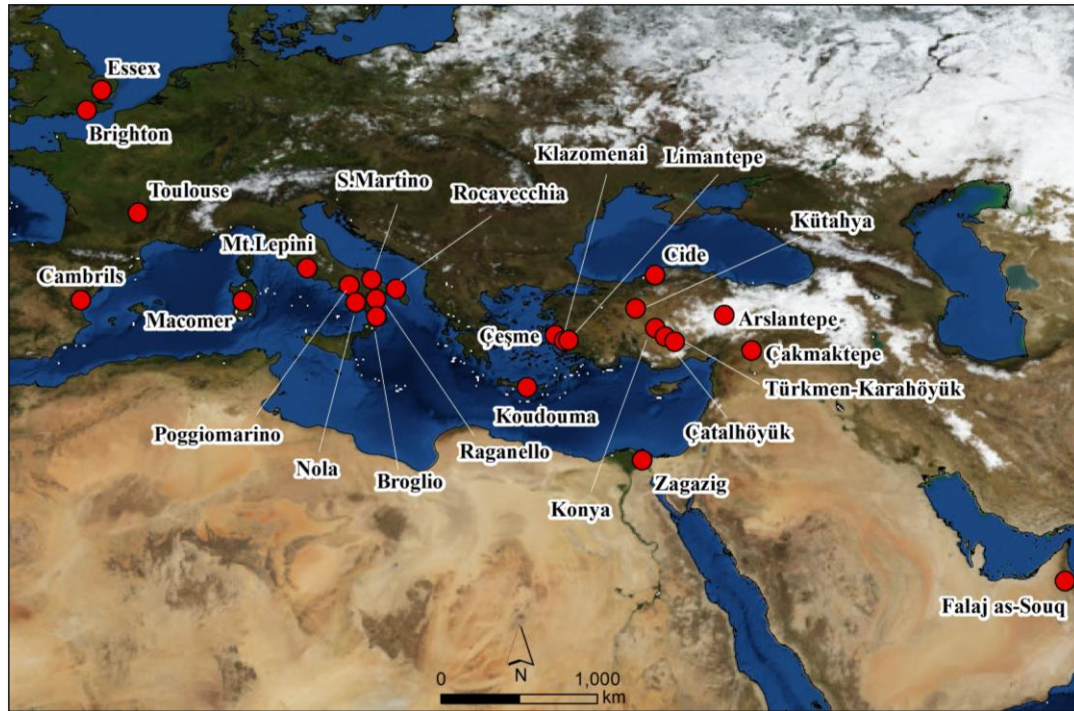
